# Modular Musings By John Emmot

The Pikes Peak Division has held another successful Trainshow in Colorado Springs. April 16 was a good day for the Division. We fielded a 28 X 12 foot layout for the enjoyment of those attending the swapmeet. The modules included the Division orphans along with those from Thomson and Lutt, Gelsinger, Hansz, Marchbanks and for the first time at a Division show, D. Attig. D. brought his new 8 foot pair of engine and car maintenance facilities. They featured some interesting lighting and backdrop techniques and on-the-fly scenicing. The layout ran well, though track three was not available to complete a circle. We used teathered DCC and radio DC successfully on tracks one and two. There was no joy with radio DCC and we may have to send some components to NCE for checkout. If there is anyone in the area who really knows NCE DCC troubleshooting, we invite your participation. We had good help through out the day. D. watched train watchers all day. Jerry Hansz brought and ran a Santa Fe freight and a long military equipment train. Andy Buco ran a Santa Fe freight. Irv Johnson ran a Rio Grande passenger consist and Bill Galloway ran a Santa Fe passenger train. John Emmot ran the usual Missouri Pacific freight. If I have missed anyone here, I apologize. Wade Mountz again helped transport the orphans to and from the show. Many Division members were present to help setup the layout and the swap tables on Friday evening.

There were several good conversations with folks in the area who have or would like to have model trains and cards with our contact information were handed out. We may want to see if the local train shops will let us post a sheet with our contact info as some folks said they hadn't heard of the Division before.

Again, let me encourage anyone who can to participate in future module setups. I've never been to one where we had too much help. See you at the meeting.

My thanks is given to Bill Galloway for doing the first two pages of this issue. I hope that you will enjoy this and future issues of the milepost.

The division had another successful train show in April and I thank Dusty and all those that helped him make it a success. I think that we should consider doing another show in October or November at the church again. I thought that we had a good crowd and if we continue to get the word out and people know where we are the crowd should stay the same.

Now a few thoughts on the trailer for the modules. I have seen several variations on this but here are my thoughts. I suggest a trailer that is 6' or 6 ½ 'wide at least 12' long and 6 ½' tall. The trailer should have a pointed front which would work well for the corners in a stacked or shelved fashion. A side door would be nice though not essential. It should have exposed wood on the inside walls to facilitate the mounting of shelves (railing) to put the modules on. We should be able to get modules stacked 3 high in the trailer plus the dog bones on the floor without scenery. At this length of trailer and for best performance during towing a double axle trailer would be best. One more thing to think about vehicles in Colorado pulling a trailer with two axles is required to have working trailer brakes (at least that is my understanding).

We can build supports to put the 4' modules on so we can put them crossways in the trailer. I have some wood that we could use to build these supports for the modules. I would be interested in being able to keep my modules in a trailer. I am also willing to provide a spot to store the trailer. The ability to hook and go and not worrying about loading would be nice.

A suggestion that I heard made after John had left the church after the train show was to have the Region be the owner of the trailer and buy it for us to use and get the region to pay for tags. We in turn would lease the trailer from the Region. The primary puller or pullers of the trailer should add it to their insurance.

I am for the building of one or two inside corners to increase the setup possibilities for the modules. Personally I would like to be able to use all 4 of my modules at setups. Jerry Drews had a good idea of having the youth in model railroading helping build the inside corners. I think that I have given enough thoughts for this month.




